VANCOUVER - B.C.'s Sonora Resort has been voted the number one luxury hotel in Canada by TripAdvisor's 2011 Travelers' Choice Awards.

The Relais & Chateaux resort, located in the Discovery Islands at the mouth of Bute Inlet, scored 100 per cent in the ratings.

Eight of the top 10 luxury hotels in Canada cited in the TripAdvisor awards are in B.C.

The others are: L'Hermitage Hotel, Vancouver; Shangri-La Hotel, Vancouver; Wedgewood Hotel & Spa, Vancouver; Pan Pacific Whistler Village Centre; Fairmont Pacific Rim, Vancouver; Nita Lake Lodge, Whistler; and Magnolia Hotel and Spa, Victoria.
